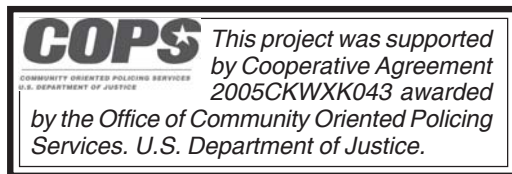

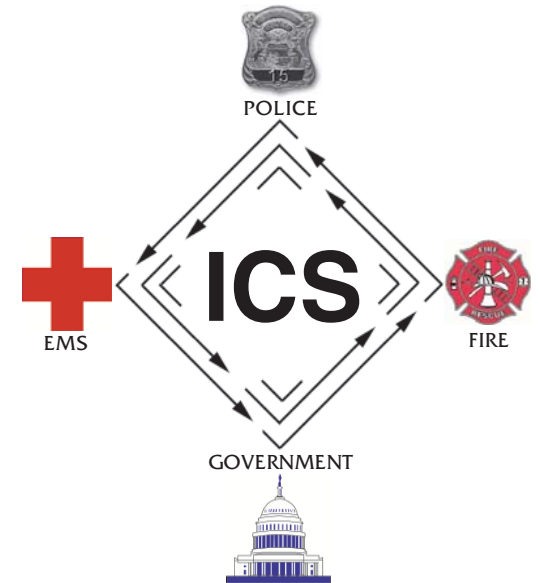

UNIFIED INCIDENT COMMAND SYSTEMS FOR LAW ENFORCEMENT

The events of 9/11 changed the world and how law enforcement must prepare for the future. In today's environment police must not only plan for crime, but also widespread events of catastrophic proportions.

Unified Incident Command Systems (UICS) training assists field police personnel in organizing a response to an incident and making sense out of chaos.

Why Incident Command?

Unified Incident Command Systems is the recognized emergency management format for use during "all risks" emergencies. It is utilized by both local and state governments, as well as the federal government, including the FBI and The Department of Homeland Security.

Training in the Unified Incident Command System will provide field personnel the management tools with which to handle emergencies, work effectively with other agencies, and establish a margin of safety for themselves and the citizens they serve.

Who Should Attend?

All law enforcement officers should be versed in the fundamentals of Unified Incident Command, especially those officers who are likely to command a critical incident.

Program Objectives:

- ◆ Identify the need for an organized approach to the management of emergency incidents;
- ◆ Identify the law and standards that require an organized approach to managing emergency situations;
- ◆ Identify the responsibilities of the Incident Commander (IC) and command staff positions;
- ◆ Learn the logical expansion of the Unified Incident Command System and interrelationship of the various elements and functions;
- ◆ Apply the principles of the Unified Incident Command System to emergency scenarios of various sizes, types and complexities; and
- ◆ Demonstrate the ability to use the major functions of the Unified Incident Command System (UICS) through a structured group activity.

Program Focus:

The 16-hour Unified Incident Command Systems Workshop focuses on the management of law enforcement field operations in "all risks" emergencies, including those of a criminal, environmental and terrorist nature. A variety of formats are utilized to deliver the program concentrating on the application of the Unified Incident Command System.

Facilitator:

Mr. Charles Bouth has over 32 years of law enforcement experience and served as Chief of Police in Sault Ste. Marie, Michigan as well as that city's fire chief. He is currently an Assistant Fire Chief with the City of Lansing, Michigan. Mr. Bouth brings diverse experience to the classroom, having commanded a variety of police, fire, and EMS incidents utilizing the Incident Command System. His teaching experience of over 30 years greatly assists in relating classroom information to practical application.
